



SKELETON COAST FLY-IN SAFARI

Highlights: Sossusvlei, Skeleton Coast, Kaokoland, Ovahimba, Ugab and Hoarusib Valleys, Kunene River.

This exclusive tour visits the untouched Skeleton Coast and the wilderness of the Kaokoland. Guests get a fabulous bird's eye view of the desolate coast and the diverse and ever-changing geological formations of Namibia. Accommodation is in three fully equipped tented desert camps. Guests will fly in a private plane with an ultra-knowledgeable host and guide to some of the most remote & beautiful areas left in the world, including meeting the nomadic Himba people and tracking the desert elephant and endangered black rhino. Groups are small and the safari lasts four days. This package can be also be used as an add-on to other tours or built into the itinerary of other tours.

Tue Huab Valley, Damaraland

Leaving Windhoek, we fly via the Namib Desert to Sossusvlei, an area marked by the highest dunes on earth. After the visit, continue over the Kuiseb Canyon and Conception Bay, where we have a spectacular aerial view of the famous Eduard Bohlen shipwreck that stranded here in 1909, into the Skeleton Coast. Continuing with a low-level flight northwards over the seal colony at Cape Cross and the Ugab formations, numerous black ridges that contrast sharply with the white desert floor, we cross to our camp in the Huab Valley where we stay for the night.
Kuidas Camp (L, D)

Wed Hoarusib Valley, Kaokoland

We depart by Land Rover into the Huab Valley with its rich and amazing diversity of flora and fauna. Flying along the coast to Terrace Bay, we enjoy a bird's eye view of the Montrose and Henrietta, the most prominent shipwrecks along this part of the coast.

Accessing the roaring dunes by vehicle, we visit the beach with its profusion of multi-coloured pebbles, before flying north into the Hoarusib Valley where we stay for the night.
Purros Camp (FB)

Thu Hartmann Valley, Kaokoland

After breakfast we embark on a scenic drive along the Hoarusib Valley to visit a settlement of the nomadic Himba people, after which we continue north along the Skeleton Coast by aircraft to the Kunene River, where the Kaiu Maru shipwreck and pieces from old sailing vessels lie scattered along the forlorn beach. We take a scenic drive by Land Rover through mountains and dunes of the Hartmann Valley reaching our Kunene River camp in the late afternoon.
Kunene River Camp (FB)

Fri Hartmann Valley, Kaokoland

We enjoy an early morning boat trip on the Kunene River as it flows through scenic desert landscape, observing bird life and possibly some crocodiles. Birds vary from aquatic species on the perennial waters, to endemic desert varieties and those that inhabit dense riverine vegetation. After lunch at the camp, we fly back to Eros Airport, Windhoek, arriving in the late afternoon. (B, L)

Other combination options available:

- Skeleton Coast Safari as stand alone without the Sossusvlei option (4 days, 3 nights)
- Skeleton Coast Safari combined with Sossusvlei and the Etosha National Park (5 days, 4 nights)
- Skeleton Coast Safari combined with Sossusvlei, NamibRand Nature Reserve and Lüderitz (6 days, 5 nights)
